ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING 2019

I am pleased to send you details of our 2019 annual general meeting ("AGM"), which will be held at Crowne Plaza Birmingham City Centre, Central Square, Holiday Street, Birmingham B1 1HH on 28 November 2019 at 11.00 a.m. It is booked for Meeting Room 8 and I hope that you will be able to attend.

The formal notice of the AGM ("Notice") enclosed with this letter sets out the business to be considered at the AGM. The purpose of this letter is to provide you with further details about those items of business.

This year, shareholders will be asked to approve 14 resolutions. Resolutions 1 to 11 are proposed as ordinary resolutions. This means that, for each of those resolutions to be passed, more than 50 per cent of the votes cast must be in favour of the resolution. Resolutions 12 to 14 are proposed as special resolutions. This means that, for each of those resolutions to be passed, at least 75 per cent of the votes cast must be in favour of the resolution.

Resolution 1: Annual report and accounts

The directors must present the Company's annual accounts and directors' and auditors' reports to shareholders at a general meeting. Those to be presented at the AGM are in respect of the year ended 30 June 2019, and are called the Annual Report 2019. The Annual Report 2019 is available on the Company's website www.cvsukltd.co.uk/.

Resolution 2: Directors' remuneration report

The Company is seeking shareholder approval of the part of its directors' remuneration report which describes how the Company's directors' remuneration policy has been implemented during the previous financial year.

The relevant part of the directors' remuneration report is set out within pages 48 to 55 of the Annual Report 2019.

This vote is advisory only, therefore it does not affect the historical remuneration paid to any individual director.

Resolution 3: Final dividend

The directors are recommending a final dividend for the year ended 30 June 2019 of 5.5 pence per ordinary share. If approved, the final dividend will be paid on 6 December 2019 to shareholders whose names appear on the register at the close of business on 22 November 2019.

Resolutions 4 to 8: Reappointment of directors

The Board has decided that it is good corporate governance for all directors to be reappointed each year, so in accordance with that decision, all directors are standing for re-election at the AGM.

Resolutions 4 to 8 propose the reappointment of Richard Connell, Simon Innes, Richard Fairman, Deborah Kemp and Mike McCollum respectively as directors.

Biographies of the directors are set out on pages 42 to 43 of the Annual Report 2019.

Resolutions 9 and 10: Appointment and remuneration of auditors

The Company is required to appoint auditors at each general meeting at which its annual accounts and reports are presented to shareholders. The Audit Committee has recommended to the Board that Deloitte LLP be proposed for re-appointment. Therefore, resolution 9 proposes the re-appointment of Deloitte LLP as auditors (to hold office until the next such meeting), and, in accordance with normal practice, resolution 10 authorises the directors to determine the auditors' remuneration.

Resolution 11: Authority to allot shares

Generally, the directors may only allot shares in the Company (or grant rights to subscribe for, or to convert any security into, shares in the Company) if they have been authorised to do so by shareholders in general meeting.

Resolution 11 renews a similar authority given at last year's AGM and, if passed, will authorise the directors to allot shares in the Company (and to grant such rights) up to an aggregate nominal amount of 23,551,653 (which represents approximately one-third of the issued ordinary share capital of the Company as at 1 November 2019, being the last practicable date before the publication of this document). If given, this authority will expire at the conclusion of the Company's next AGM or on 28 February 2021 (whichever is the earlier). It is the directors' intention to renew this authority each year.

The directors have no current intention to exercise the authority sought under resolution 11.

Resolutions 12 and 13: Disapplication of pre-emption rights

Generally, if the directors wish to allot new shares or other equity securities (within the meaning of section 560 of the Companies Act 2006 ("Act")) for cash then under the Act they must first offer such shares or securities to shareholders in proportion to their existing holdings. These statutory pre-emption rights may be disapplied by shareholders.

Resolutions 12 and 13, which will be proposed as special resolutions, renew a similar power given at last year's AGM and, if passed, will enable the directors to allot equity securities for cash without having to comply with statutory pre-emption rights.

The powers proposed under resolution 12 will be limited to allotments:

- (a) in connection with a rights issue, open offer or other pre-emptive offer to ordinary shareholders and to holders of other equity securities (if required by the rights of those securities or the directors otherwise consider necessary), but (in accordance with normal practice) subject to such exclusions or other arrangements, such as for fractional entitlements and overseas shareholders, as the directors consider necessary; and
- (b) in any other case, up to an aggregate nominal amount of 3,532,747 (which represents approximately five per cent of the issued ordinary share capital of the Company as at 1 November 2019, being the last practicable date before the publication of this document).

The powers proposed under resolution 13 will be limited to allotments:

- (a) up to an aggregate nominal amount of 3,532,747 (which represents approximately five per cent of the issued ordinary share capital of the Company as at 1 November 2019, being the last practicable date before the publication of this document); and
- (b) used only for the purposes of financing (or refinancing, if such refinancing occurs within six months of the original transaction) a transaction which the directors determine to be an acquisition or other capital investment of a kind contemplated by the Statement of Principles on Disapplying Pre-Emption Rights most recently published by the Pre-Emption Group prior to the date of this notice.

The directors intend to follow the provisions in the Statement of Principles issued by The Pre Emption Group (as updated in March 2015) and not allot shares on a non-pre-emptive basis pursuant to the authorities in resolution 12 and 13:

- in excess of an amount equal to 5 per cent of the total issued ordinary share capital of the Company (excluding treasury shares); or
- in excess of an amount equal to 7.5 per cent of the total issued ordinary share capital of the Company (excluding treasury shares) within a rolling three-year period,

in each case other than (i) in connection with one or more acquisition or specified capital investments announced contemporaneously with the allotment or which has taken place in the preceding six month period and is disclosed in the announcement of the allotment or (ii) is suitable consultation has been undertaken in advance and an explanation given.

If given, this power will expire at the conclusion of the Company's next AGM or on 28 February 2021 (whichever is the earlier). It is the directors' intention to renew this power each year.

Resolution 14: Purchase by the Company of its own shares

Resolution 14, which will be proposed as a special resolution, renews a similar authority given at last year's AGM. If passed, it will allow the Company to purchase up to 7,065,495 ordinary shares in the market (which represents approximately 10 per cent of the issued ordinary share capital of the Company as at 1 November 2019, being the last practicable date before the publication of this document). The minimum and maximum prices for such a purchase are set out in the resolution. If given, this authority will expire at the conclusion of the Company's next AGM or on 28 February 2021 (whichever is the earlier). It is the directors' intention to renew this authority each year.

The directors have no current intention to exercise the authority sought under resolution 14 to make market purchases, but consider the authority desirable to provide maximum flexibility in the management of the Company's capital base.

Recommendation

The Board considers that all the resolutions that will be put to the AGM are in the best interests of the Company and its shareholders as a whole and recommends that you vote in favour of them.

Notes

Entitlement to attend and vote

1. The right to vote at the meeting is determined by reference to the register of members. Only those shareholders registered in the register of members of the Company as at close of business on 26 November 2019 (or, if the meeting is adjourned, the close of business on the date which is two working days before the date of the adjourned meeting) shall be entitled to attend and vote at the meeting in respect of the number of shares registered in their name at that time. Changes to entries in the register of members after that time shall be disregarded in determining the rights of any person to attend or vote (and the number of votes they may cast) at the meeting.

Proxies

2. A shareholder is entitled to appoint another person as his or her proxy to exercise all or any of his or her rights to attend and to speak and vote at the meeting. A proxy need not be a shareholder of the Company.

A shareholder may appoint more than one proxy in relation to the meeting, provided that each proxy is appointed to exercise the rights attached to a different share or shares held by that shareholder.
